May 3, 2009

Ezekiel - Dry Bones

Ezekiel 37:1-14

God told Ezekiel to speak to the dry bones in the field and make them come back to life. God did such things to get the attention of the Israelites. When Ezekiel spoke, the bones began to come together. Have your child draw (or you can draw) a body. See how many parts on the body your child can name. Try the basic ones like head, eyes, ears, and so on. Then try some harder ones like elbow, knee, ankle, shoulder, and waist. Ask your child what happened when Ezekiel spoke to the bones like God told him to do.

May 10, 2009

Fruits of the Spirit (Love, Joy, Peace)

Galatians 5:22-23

Your child heard about love, joy, and peace this week. They are ours when we try to live our lives like God wants us to live. Use the tune of “The Wheels on the Bus” with these words and teach the song to your child.

May 17, 2009

Fruits of the Spirit (Patience, Kindness, Generosity)

Galatians 5:22-23

One of the fruits of the Spirit that your child learned about this week is kindness. Work together with your child to bake a special treat and then take it to someone you know. As you “Bake and Take” together with your child, remind him or her that God wants us to be kind to others.

May 24, 2009

Fruits of the Spirit (Faithfulness, Gentleness, Self-Control)

Galatians 5:22-23

Make "Memory Game" type cards. Draw nine different fruits on index cards and make two of each one. (Try any of these: apple, banana, orange, grapes, peach, lemon, strawberry, cherries, watermelon, pineapple, limes, or pears.) Let your child help you color the fruits before you play the matching game. Now write one of the "fruits" of the Spirit on each set of cards. Read Galatians 5:22-23 to find them. Your child will not need to read the words, but you can mention them as you play the game. The words will be familiar to them since they have heard them in their Bible lessons these last few weeks. Turn all eighteen cards upside down. Let your child choose two cards and see if they match. If not, turn them back over. If they do match, your child gets to keep the cards. Now you can take a turn. Continue until all the matches have been found.

May 31, 2009

Pentecost

Acts 2:1-21, 37-47

A loud noise like a strong wind was heard as the people gathered for Pentecost. Help your child make a windsock to hang outside. Take a large sheet of craft foam and let your child color it with permanent markers however he or she wishes. You may want to put an old shirt on your child while letting him or her use permanent markers. Once it is decorated, roll the craft foam into a tube so that the two ends meet. Staple the ends together. You can also attach strips of paper or crepe paper streamers to the bottom edge. Add a string to the top right and left so the windsock can be hung outside. God is kind of like the wind. We do not see him, but we can tell God is there.
